Start: Birchen Edge car park

- Turn left out of the car park, walk along the road verge and turn left up a track immediately after the B&B. At the end of the short track turn left through the wooden gate and continue along the path under Birchen Edge.
- 2. When you are level with the monument up above you on the rocks, walk a further 250 meters (approx) along the path you are on, until you reach a very large boulder on your left, with the letters ME DS carved into it. (Can you find the token drop?)
- 3. Turn right up a trodden path onto Birchen Edge.
- 4. When you reach the trig point turn right.
- 5. Near the end of Birchen Edge where there is a water hydrant sign next to the path, follow the path steeply downhill, taking you off Birchen Edge and returning you to the lower path you were on earlier.
- **6.** Turn left along this path and make your way back to the car park.
